This letter is a final response to your request for information pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552, dated July 8, 2021 and received in this office on July 9, 2021. Your request was forwarded to the appropriate office to search for documents that may be responsive to your request.

You requested the following: Student Defense hereby requests that ED produce the following in the time and manner required

under the Freedom of Information Act and the Department's regulations. Records sufficient to show:

- 1. The total number of borrowes who have received refunds of wages garnished since March 13, 2020 and the total dolar value of those refunds.
- 2. Of the borrowers who have not received refunds of wages garnished since March 13, 2020, the total number who do not have valid addresses on file with the Department

Attached to this e-mail are 0 pages of documents responsive to your request. The documents provided are:

## However, FSA provided the information below:

- 1. The total number of borrowers who have received refunds of wages garnished since March 13, 2020 and the total dollar value of those refunds.
  - a. As of July 19, 2021, FSA has issued refunds of garnishment payments to 382,306 unique borrowers totaling \$187,231,062.27
- 2. Of the borrowers who have not received refunds of wages garnished since March 13, 2020, the total number who do not have valid addresses on file with the Department
  - a. 10,868 borrowers are owed a refund of a garnishment payment that FSA has not been able to issue because the borrower's address is known to be invalid

Provisions of the FOIA allow us to recover the costs pertaining to your request. The Department has concluded that you fall within the category of Other. However, the Department has provided you with this information at no charge. The Department's release of this information at no cost does not constitute the grant of a fee waiver and does not infer or imply that you will be granted a fee waiver for future requests made under FOIA to the Department.
